<u>Description:</u> In this class, we'll go back in time to ancient Mesopotamia, Egypt, India, China, Rome, and more to learn about the cultures, governments, artistic and scientific breakthroughs that form the foundations of our modern societies. Each civilization will include a hands-on art, STEM, or cultural project to allow for reflection and critical thinking about ancient history and modern connections. Students will acquire a broad overview of ancient history, with opportunities for more in-depth study.

- * As their **final project presentation**, students will research a subtopic from a civilization of their choice.
